Joe and Max wonder who will find the new time capsule in the future and solve the next backyard mystery.











Most paper is made from wood, which comes from trees. To make paper, wood is mixed

The history of paper

The Chinese started making paper nearly 2,000 years ago. For a long time, people made paper by hand. Now paper mills use machines to make paper. with water and crushed. This makes paper pulp. The pulp is then pressed into thin sheets of paper and dried. Paper pulp can be bleached to make white paper or dyed to make coloured paper.




