Communication with our school

As a parent or carer, you are an important part of our school community. We know that you play a crucial role in helping your child become a motivated learner. Communication between our school and our community is critical for us to partner together.

To give our teachers the opportunity to recharge, spend time with their families and bring their best creative selves to work, we are setting clear expectations for when and how they respond to communication outside

school operating hours. This means teachers may not reply to non-emergency messages or emails outside of school operating hours.

Please use the school's email address (tregear-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au) for non-emergencies in the first instance or via our School Bytes Portal. Our staff will respond to your queries within 2 school days under normal circumstances.

For longer discussions or complex matters, we ask parents and carers to make an appointment to speak to teachers directly, at a time that works best for everyone. It is expected that you will share concerns with your child's teacher or stage supervisor in the first instance.

For emergencies, please contact the School Office on 96286301. Emergencies include serious student health, safety and wellbeing issues.

Our staff will always stay in touch because open communication is what's best for your child and their education. We don't want you to stop communicating with your teachers – we still want to hear from you if you have any questions or need to discuss a matter about your child. We know it's often easier to send emails or messages after work or school. We will make sure we read and respond in school operating hours. Our dedicated teachers want to help our students achieve their best – we're on the same team.

Term 2 attendance

Currently we have **176 out of 362 students** achieving the goal of 85% or above attendance. Our focus is to increase the number of students maintaining the 85% attendance target. Please encourage your child to attend school each day unless they are unwell. Thank you to those parents who are using My Family Hand and School Bytes to notify the school of your child's absence.



Don't forget... students must achieve over 85% attendance, or all absences must be explained, to ensure your child receives their icecream reward in Week 10.



Safety is always our first priority

At Tregear Public School, we have a variety of Emergency Response Procedures to maintain the safety of our staff and students. It is important that we hold drills to ensure everyone is clear on the correct procedure and expectations. Next week we will be teaching the students what they are expected to do in a LOCKDOWN prior to holding a drill towards the end of the week.

LOCKDOWN is a procedure implemented when an active threat is identified or notified by Police and it is determined that the students, staff and visitors should be kept securely inside the building due to a serious risk of injury. In this emergency situation, the aim is for everyone to remain inside the school buildings out of sight, with all doors and windows locked. During a LOCKDOWN, students cannot continue learning activities and are required to remain still and quiet within the building until the threat is over.

A SECURE ALERT (LOCKOUT) is implemented when a threat is contained, and no-one is in immediate risk of harm. During a SECURE ALERT, once all staff and students are accounted for, classes can continue to engage in learning activities. This week we have implemented a SECURE ALERT. Students were required to remain inside their classrooms but were able to continue with their learning until it was determined it was safe to resume normal school operations and move freely around the school.

We may implement our SECURE ALERT procedures in the following instances:

- There is a threat in the playground, like a stray dog
- A student is displaying heightened behaviour
- Police have notified of a threat close to the school

Please note: A SECURE ALERT response may be upgraded at any time to a LOCKDOWN if the threat or risk increases.

Confirmed COVId-19 cases

We have been advised; members of the school community have recently tested positive to COVID-19. Students in Stages 2 and 3 and staff who worked with this group of students may have had contact with the person while infectious with COVID-19.

While testing and isolation is no longer mandatory for anyone exposed to COVID-19, NSW Health have Advice for people exposed to COVID-19 <u>Advice for people exposed to COVID-19 | NSW Government</u> Students and staff should not attend school if they are sick. COVID-19 symptoms include fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell/taste, muscle/joint pains, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, extreme tiredness, unexplained chest pain or conjunctivitis (eye infection). If symptoms occur at any time, your child should not attend school until they are well and symptom-free. The safety and well-being of our students and staff remains our priority. Headlice

Recently we have had parents and carers make reports of their children catching headlice from school. I have included some information to assist with preventing the spread of headlice among our community. Thank you in advance for your support and cooperation.

Head lice (nits) are a common problem in primary school aged children. Head lice do not spread disease, but their bites can cause itching and sometimes skin irritation. There are safe and effective ways to treat head lice at home.

What are head lice?

Head lice are tiny wingless insects about the size of a sesame seed that live in the hair of humans and animals where they feed on blood by biting the skin. Head lice commonly affect children, but adults can also have lice.

What are the symptoms of head lice?

Lice often cause itching of the skin. Bites can cause the skin to become red and irritated, which can be made worse by scratching.

You can see the lice and nits (eggs) if you look closely at your head and scalp. Nits look like tiny white dots attached firmly to the hair. They cannot be brushed or flicked off the hair but must be physically removed with fingers or fingernails or special nit combs.

How are head lice spread?

Head lice are only found on the human head or hair. Lice can spread when people are in close contact and when they share an affected comb or hairbrush.

Lice need warmth and blood to survive so they do not live for long on furniture, hats, bedding, carpet or anywhere else in the environment.

How are head lice treated?

There are two main treatment options for head lice:

- wet combing using conditioner and a fine-tooth comb
- chemical removal using synthetic or natural insecticides

The wet combing method is a cheap and effective way to treat head lice. The conditioner doesn't kill the lice, but it briefly stuns them, making it easier for the nit comb to trap and remove the lice and eggs. If you decide to use chemical treatment, it is important that you follow the instructions closely. Repeat the chemical treatment in a week to kill any newly hatched eggs.

No single treatment works for everyone. You might need to try a few different treatments or a combination to find the method that works best for you.

Should I keep my child home from school?

There is no requirement to keep children home from school or childcare as long as effective treatment begins before the next day of school or childcare.

Can head lice be prevented?

It is difficult to prevent head lice. There is no evidence that chemical or herbal products can ward off head lice. Some people think that having clean hair can prevent head lice — but head lice are attracted to hair — long or short, clean or not.
